When it comes to our faith, what should Jesus expect from us?

Genuine faith makes Jesus smile

Matthew 8: 10 Taken aback, Jesus said, "I've yet to come across this kind of simple trust in Israel, the very people who are supposed to know all about God and how he works.

When it comes to faith, Jesus gives us a thumbs up when...

1. WE SEEK HIM (JESUS) AND NOT A SIGN. (John 6:26, 30)

John 6: 36 But as I told you, you have seen me and still you do not believe.

Two reasons why we cannot use signs to create faith:

- A. Others besides Jesus can perform signs as well (Matthew 24:24—false messiahs and prophets/2 Thessalonians 2:9—Satan)
- B. A sign's purpose is not to create faith in Jesus but to point us to...Jesus.

Hebrews 11: 1 Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.

2. OUR FAITH HAS A HEALTHY RELATIONSHIP TO WORKS. (James 2:14-18)

Martin Luther, "The sort of faith that justifies is "fides viva", a "living faith". Faith inevitably, necessarily, and immediately yields the fruit of righteousness."

Justification is by faith alone, but not by a faith that is alone.
