(1). Consistent in Discipline

Proverbs 22: 6 Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it.

(2). Consistent in Teaching Values

Micah 6: 8 He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

(3). Consistent in Teaching Responsibility.

I Timothy 5: 8 Anyone who does not provide for their relatives, and especially for their own household, has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.
